NECOS Inc was adjudicated the successful recipient of grant from the City of Saskatoon. NECOS Inc is approved for \$2520.00 in Cultural Connectivity category through SK Lottery Community Grant 2020 and \$2500.00 in sports (Howzat Smash It! Cricket League through SK Lottery Community Micro Grant 2020.

The cultural connectivity program is delayed due to COVID-19. The cricket league is schedule to start end of the August.
